Upcoming Events include:



Some ideas we have for this are house flags (colorful flags that hang from the porch identifying Enright Ridge Ecovillage) and additional large flower pots placed periodically along the street. Preserving and Improving Housing by Beth O'Hara

This committee has been exploring ways to increase the safety, beauty, and value of Enright Ridge by purchasing and rehabbing property that is for sale and has a high risk of being used as investment property. The committee has decided to become a non-profit organization to better meet these goals.

We are currently investigating the building at the corner of Enright and West 8th Street for purchase and rehab. If we purchase the building, our goal is to turn the building into an appealing gateway to our street by rehabbing the property, renting the store front, and ensuring the building is safe for residents.
